The Duke and Duchess of York arrived
at Monmouth on Monday on a week's

the Hendre. The occasion was to have
been a purely private one; but, in deference
to the wishes of the people of Monmouth,
who had not received for generations
past an official Royal visit, their
Royal highnesses, conceded that the day
of their arrival should be regarded in the
light of a public function, and consented
to receive an address of welcome from
the mayor on behalf of the townspeople.
The mayor's little daughter handed a
bouquet of white roses to the Duchess.
The Hendre, Lord Llangattock's residence,
lies in a finely-wooded country
four miles west of Monmouth. On Friday
the Duchess of York visited Tintern
abbey, driving from Hendre on a motor
car. The weather was fine. Her Royal
highness afterwards proceeded to Chepstow
castle.
